Abstract	The collection documents Mari-Luci Jaramillo's professional life as an educator in primary education, bilingual reform, higher education, and in the private sector work. Her state service consisted of two positions at the University of New Mexico, and her federal service culminated in her appointment as U.S. Ambassador to Honduras, 1977-1980. The collection also provides information on Mari-Luci Jaramillo's family history, childhood, education, adulthood, and post-retirement activities.

Biography

Mari Luci Jaramillo (nee Antuna) was born June 19, 1928 in Las Vegas, New Mexico to a mother of Hispanic descent. Her grandparents were farmers; her father was an immigrant from Mexico and a shoemaker. At a time when few Hispanics completed high school, she overcame extreme poverty, among many obstacles, to become a national and world leader. She worked her way through college working in her father's shoe shop shining shoes and also cleaning houses. She earned her bachelor's and master's degrees from New Mexico Highlands University (NMHU). In 1970, she received her Ph.D. in Curriculum and Instruction, with a minor in Latin American Studies from the University of New Mexico (UNM). She started her career as an elementary school teacher in Gonzales Ranch in Northern New Mexico. A year later the family moved back to Las Vegas, NM. She taught school there for eight years becoming the Language Arts Supervisor for all of San Miguel County.

In 1964, she and her family (first husband Horacio Ulibarri and three children) moved to Albuquerque, NM. Here she applied to work as a teacher in the Albuquerque Public Schools (APS) and was hired immediately, assigned to Riverview Elementary in the Barelvas community. This is now the site of the National Hispanic Cultural Center's History and Literary Arts building. While still at Riverview, she was invited to join the faculty at UNM. The position at UNM opened an opportunity for her to get involved in programs all over Latin America. At the same time, she also became a national speaker.

On April Fool's Day in 1977, President Carter asked her to be the United States Ambassador to Honduras. She was the first Latina to serve as Ambassador; and the first woman in the western hemisphere to do so. After four

years in Honduras, and a brief period as U.S. Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs, she returned to UNM. She stayed at UNM for three years and took early retirement. Her retirement didn't last too long. She next accepted a position as a Vice President for Educational Testing Service in the San Francisco Bay Area, where she worked for 12 years.

In 1993, upon returning to Albuquerque, President Clinton called her to ask her to accept a position in the Pentagon as Deputy Assistant Secretary of Defense for Latin America. A position she held for four years, before her final retirement from service. Ambassador Jaramillo has served on numerous boards throughout her career, and even in her retirement, she continues to serve. She was appointed to the New Mexico Highlands University Board of Regents. She served on the Board of Directors at the National Institute against Prejudice and Violence in Baltimore, MD; as well as Board of the National Association of Latino Elected and Appointed Officials, Washington, D.C. She also has served on the Board of Directors of the NHCC Foundation.

Arrangement

The collection is organized into two series and eight subseries. Original order and file names were preserved wherever possible. Folders are arranged alphabetically and chronologically.

Series I: Professional Life, 1958-2008 documents Mari-Luci Jaramillo's numerous positions in primary education and bilingual reform, higher education, federal service, and the private sector. The series consists of five subseries: Biographical and Profile Material; Correspondence and Notes; Itineraries and Activities; Appointments, Affiliations and Memberships; and Speeches. A: Biographical and Profile Material, 1971-2004 consists of resumes, curricula vitae, biographies and profiles used in professional directories mostly supplied by Jaramillo. The subseries also contains biographical articles from various magazines and newsletters. The subseries is arranged chronologically. Subseries B: Correspondence and Notes, 1965-2006 contains professional correspondence related to Mari-Luci Jaramillo's various positions and appointments throughout her career as an educator and political appointee. It covers various administrative and functional topics. It is arranged chronologically and has a partial item level inventory list. Subseries C: Itineraries and Activities, 1970-2000 documents mostly her ambassadorial duties and service with the United States State Department and The United States Department of Defense. The subseries contains calendars, daily planners, correspondence, and itineraries of events and activities. It is arranged chronologically. Subseries D: Appointments, Affiliations and Memberships, 1958-2008 documents Mari-Luci Jaramillo's memberships and service with various local, state and national entities and organizations. Included are meeting minutes, reports and correspondence. The subseries is arranged chronologically. Subseries E: Speeches, 1976-1987 contain mostly her speeches while United States Ambassador to Honduras, as well as speeches and writings on the future of bilingual education and the role of Hispanic youth in higher education. The subseries arrangement is chronological. Subseries F: Writings and Publications, 1966-2003 relate to articles and an unpublished book manuscript. Subseries G: News Clippings and Scrapbooks, 1965-1996 contain newspaper and magazine articles on Jaramillo's career and recollection of various position she held in scrapbook format. Subseries H: Photographs and Video, 1964-2002 document her career in images and one VHS video cassette. This subseries consists of more than 1250 images available on the NM Digital Collections website. Subseries I: Awards and Acknowledgements, 1964-2001 contains three dimensional objects lauding her professional positions and career.

Series II: Personal Life, 1905-2013 documents Mari-Luci Jaramillo's family history, childhood, education, adulthood, and post-retirement activities. The series consists of three subseries: Correspondence and Writings; News Clippings and Scrapbooks; Photographs and Albums. Subseries A: Correspondence and Writings, 1957-2000 contains personal correspondence to her mother and grandmother relating Mari-Luci Jaramillo's appointment as Ambassador to Honduras appointments. Also included are numerous greeting cards and later life writings covering her post-retirement activities and personal beliefs. It is arranged chronologically and has a partial item level inventory list. Subseries B: News Clippings and Scrapbooks, 1945-1999 consists of various newspaper and magazine articles documenting her early education and family events. The subseries is arranged

chronologically. Subseries C: Photographs and Albums, 1905-2013 contains images of her as a child, young adult, mother, and wife. The photographs are mostly black and white and provide strong genealogical information regarding relatives, her journey into adulthood, and her activities post-retirement and into old age. Subseries D: Awards and Acknowledgements
Subseries E: Mementos and Memorabilia
